

Lawmakers request Palin emails

JUNEAU, Alaska (AP) — Three state lawmakers have requested copies of emails sent and received by [Sarah Palin](#) while she was Alaska's governor.

A spokeswoman for Gov. [Sean Parnell](#) said copies will be provided to the legislative offices of Sen. [Dennis Egan](#) and Reps. [Mike Doogan](#) and [Berta Gardner](#). Doogan and Gardner, of Anchorage, are splitting a copy. Egan is from Juneau.

The first email requests were made by several news organizations and individuals in September 2008, after Palin was named the GOP vice presidential nominee. Additional requests have since been made, and Parnell spokeswoman [Sharon Leighow](#) expects 17 orders to be filled Friday.

Leighow expects it will be next week before the lawmakers and others who've inquired about copies get them. She said there's one copying business in Juneau to handle the printing.
